SCHOOL FEES 2025

Up-to-date fee and levy statements will be emailed next week. As outlined in our 'Fee and Levy Policy' we aim to collect all fees before the end of October. We do however understand some families need more time to settle their fees and levies. Thank you to the families who have reached out to me to communicate a payment plan. This assists with ongoing planning and budget forecasts.

If you are experiencing financial difficulties, I urge you to make time to meet with me so that we can develop a personalised payment plan for you as well as ensure the school remains financially responsible.

FEES AND LEVIES 2026

Proposed fees and levies for 2026 were ratified at the School Advisory Council (SAC) meeting in September and have since been ratified by our governing body the Melbourne Archdiocese for Catholic Schools (MACS). All schools are now required to submit budgets to MACS to ensure that they are meeting set criteria to ensure they are financially responsible. The school Business Manager sets the fees in alignment with MACS guidelines. Below I have included a link to our fees with an explanation that was provided last year that helps inform families on the funding model for MACS schools. We haven't received a letter like this in 2025 however the model is the same and the only variables are the dollar amounts that we receive from Government funding and subsequent dollar amounts we need to charge school families.

PLACEMENT OF CHILDREN

The teachers will begin placing the children in their 2026 class groupings in the coming weeks. Teachers are aware of children's relationships and will make every effort to take these into consideration.

- Each child will be asked to nominate five friends that they would like to have in their class group for the
 following year. Every attempt will be made to place children with at least one of these children. The
 Learning Diversity Leader (Jane Weekes) in consultation with the classroom teacher will liaise with
 parents if discretion is required for a child to nominate less than 5 children based on concerns around the
 child and their progress in building social relationships.
- Parent requests for placing children with specific friends will not be considered
- Parent requests for children to be placed together, separated, with/without a specific teacher <u>will not</u> be considered

(I can only fairly and consistently implement the above if I make it a school-based process)

'Placement of Children Forms' must be submitted to Michael by <u>Tuesday 28 October</u>. In fairness to all, forms after this date cannot be accepted. Please note that forms should not be submitted to teachers or Level Leaders, i.e. any previous discussions with your child's teacher/s or letters, need to be redirected to the Principal. Please read the 'Placement of Children' policy before submitting a form to ensure any requests for consideration are consistent with the implementation steps of the policy. Year 3 / 4 Gardening





Our School garden is thriving at the moment with recent rain and warmer weather.

Xavier - We have been growing snow peas and they are flowing and the peas are ready to be eaten.

Paige - I have eaten some of the snow peas. They tasted sweet and ripe.

Hudson - The potato plants now have leaves that are turning yellow.

Vienna - The snow peas have grown a lot. The plants are now huge and tangled and have collapsed under their own weight.

Toonworld Incursion

Yesterday the Year 3 / 4 students participated in an Incursion from the team at Toonworld. The students used ipads and a program called STOP MOTION to create short movies. They had to use a background and create characters using clay. Each frame was photographed and then put together to create a movie.

Rafael - We made lots of little clay creatures and it was fun.

Cheryl - We took lots of photos and moved the characters around. We used teamwork with four people in each group.

Ethan - We learnt to use plasticine characters to make STOP MOTION movies with back drop sets.

Matilda - It was good because the presenter Kat, was really nice and we all learnt new things.









Year 5/6 Mad about Science Incursion

On Monday the year 5/6 level welcomed Caleb from Mad about Science for an incursion on natural disasters. Caleb blew us all away with his knowledge and extraordinary experiments. Caleb had a lot of interesting experiments, like the tea bag experiment. He cut the top off the tea bag and poured the leaves into a box, then he made the bag stand up and put the top of the tea bag on fire, which would make the tea bag go up like a hot air balloon to make a heat rise and see the wind reaction. The year 5/6 's loved it and it was an amazing experience. There were heaps of experiments but none were as good as instant snow. The students were shown this in order to understand what happens during an avalanche or blizzard. They were given a small amount of powder which was called sodium acetate, then they were told to put water on it. When we did that it started to expand. When we kept putting water on it, the snow kept growing. If the 5/6 's put too much water on it, it would turn transparent. Finally Caleb gave the 5/6's a challenge to craft and engineer their own buildings made out of playdough and spaghetti straws. When they were done Caleb simulated his own earthquake by rocking a wooden foundation, testing if the building was strong and well built, or too wobbly and fragile. The class loved watching their building survive or being destroyed in the mini earthquake.




The Year 5/6's had an amazing time, and everyone walked away having learnt something.
