- You have a mission


The children who shared a reading should be most proud of themselves. This can be a daunting task on such a big occasion and in front of so many people.

History Box Incursion

Last week the Year 3 / 4 students participated in an incursion with History Box. We investigated Australia's First People and The First Fleet. There were a range of activities to complete as well as an informative slideshow. Students were able to make clay figures and Love Tokens, play games and examine a range of artifacts.

Clare from the Heritage Centre welcomed our students warmly and enthusiastically shared her knowledge of Mary MacKillop and her life story through a rich presentation. Students enjoyed visiting the artifacts museum and the Chapel where a strand of St Mary MacKillop's hair is kept.


