SCHOOL CLOSURE DAY MONDAY

This coming <u>Monday 3 November</u> is a student-free day. This is an approved day for time in lieu for teachers as per the current certified agreement. Time in lieu is used to acquit additional hours that teachers are required for school activities such as camps, parent-teacher interviews etc.

FINAL DAY OF SCHOOL YEAR FOR CHILDREN

The final day of the school year for the children will be Tuesday 16 December. This has been approved by the Melbourne Archdiocese for Catholic schools and was ratified by the 2024 School Advisory Council when setting the dates for 2025. The teachers will be on-site on Wednesday 17 December. This day will be dedicated to finishing off 2025 and preparing for the 2026 school year.

STAFFING NEWS

I am pleased to announce that we have completed the employment process for two classroom teachers to fill the roles of Hannah Dalrymple and Sarah Hodgson.

Sophie Gilmore will join our staff. Sophie completed her studies in Perth in 2024 and has done casual relief teaching for 6 months in Perth and 6 months in Melbourne this year and is relocating to Melbourne. We are really delighted to have Sophie joining us. She comes as a graduate teacher with a year of casual relief teaching experience and will bring a very calm, nurturing and professional manner to St Anne's. Her references were impeccable and she will be a great teacher and member of our school community.

Clare Smith will also join our teaching team. Clare will work 4 days a week in 2026. Clare is an experienced teacher who is currently working at St Joseph's Primary School in Malvern. Clare has leadership experience and comes recommended as an outstanding teacher. She will bring leadership, passion and outstanding experience to the St Anne's community.

Both Sophie and Clare place significant value on building relationships and I believe will be perfect appointments for our school community.

The final component of our staffing is to appoint a few part-time staff to ensure our leadership team members for 2026 have their release time. We hope to finalise this and the 2026 class structures in the next few weeks. Once finalised, I will communicate these structures in a future newsletter.

ALL SAINTS' DAY MASS

Tomorrow is All Saints' Day. Today we celebrated a school Mass for All Saints' Day commencing at 9.10am. Once again the children participated in the Mass with beautiful reverence for the occasion. All Saints' Day is a feast day observing the lives of the many saints for whom there is no specific feast day during the year. Sunday marks All Souls Day. This is a day of prayer and remembrance for those who have died. We offer our prayers and thoughts for any families who are experiencing sadness or grief at this time.

WALK TO SCHOOL MORNING

This morning we had great support for our return to 'Walk to School Day'. We had **118** children join the walk. There was great excitement and community spirit and a great way to start the day. Thank you to all the parents who came along for the walk to help supervise and ensure the children arrived safely. Congratulations to Riley Holland for taking the initiative to email me and request we bring this event back. We will do another one before the end of the term.









This week all parents will have received an invitation to access a platform called Seesaw. This is a platform where students and teachers can share learning. The initial purpose of using this platform is to extend a window into some of the learning that is happening in the school. We accidentally left the parent comment function on for the first post, however have switched this off for now as the teachers need to read and approve these which is not the current purpose of the platform. For the remainder of 2025 the focus will be on sharing some learning in each year level rather than dialogue about the posted work. Every student will have a post shared with their parents on the following dates;

7th November, 21st November, 5th December, 12th December.

I have been liaising with the School Advisory Council on parent engagement in learning and this is one tool we are adopting in our strategy to enable parents and students to engage in learning dialogue together.

Each time you receive a post you can simply ask your children to tell you about the pieces of work they have posted.

I will work collaboratively with the teachers and School Advisory Council next year to review the strengths and opportunities Seesaw can offer in 2026.

STATIONERY LISTS

We are in the process of finalising stationery lists. They will be sent home on Wednesday next week. On Friday next week, the teachers will send home any excess stationery the Year 1-6 children have.

The Preps collate their stationery and have a nominal amount of additional supplies that will be retained for 2026 and removed from the book list if they have excess stationery items.

This will enable you to audit what you require when placing orders for 2026. Please send a separate bag such as a shopping bag with your child next Friday.

This week the Year 3 / 4 students participated in a Webinar titled Inform and Empower. The students learnt about being safe online. They discussed what personal information should not be shared online. This was the fourth session for the year.

Miniboss Science Incursion

Here is Sienna's reflection from the year 5/6 incursion...

Yesterday the Year 5/6 students and teachers welcomed Sammy and Ruth from Miniboss Incursions. They were a funny and engaging pair and we had lots of fun with them.

It was a day full of hypotheses, perfumed bath bombs, fun and engaging reactions, and interesting information. They taught us a lot and were very knowledgeable.

Sammy (the main scientist) shared many interesting facts. We learnt all about the Periodic Table, and how some substances can blow up in water! The periodic table is a table of elements, with a whole range of different chemicals, that react to different things. We also learnt that H2O is water and H2O2 is an acid called Hydrogen peroxide, that you can't drink.

Some students were lucky enough to try the PTC test. This test is used to determine if people can taste a compound chemical (phenylthiocarbamide). It's known to give a sour or bitter sensation to some people, while others taste nothing.

Another favourite was the foam dome. We had to guess an approximate amount of citric acid and bicarb soda to add to water and detergent. We came close to getting it right, but unfortunately most of the time it overflowed! A few other elements we added to the plastic container: The students also learnt that H2o is water and H2o2 is an acid called Hydrogen peroxide, that you can't drink.

We learnt so much and had the best time! We thank Mrs Hodgson for organising the special day! Thanks again to Sammy and Ruth for coming out to teach us!


Strawberry fair 2026
